

# WSCPA 2010 Spring Conference Class Descriptions

(This a more detailed description of a portion of the classes being offered)

## **Rx Watch**

Prescription drug abuse is rampant throughout Washington State, and Spokane County has seen an extreme increase in prescription drug abuse, addiction, overdose, and pharmacy burglaries. The Greater Spokane Substance Abuse Council (GSSAC) along with Northwest HIDTA has developed a prescription drug awareness program modeled after Meth Watch. *WA Rx Watch* covers a wealth of information including the most commonly abused prescription drugs, prenatal drug use, Internet pharmacies, doctor shopping, etc. GSSAC's goal is to conduct the *Washington State Rx Watch Community Presentation & Train the Trainer* courses throughout Washington State to build a network of presenters through coalitions/organizations for this environmental strategy.

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## **Workplace/Pharmacy, Robbery Procedures and Mock Robbery**

See a real life mock robbery conducted by the Spokane County Sheriff's Office Crime Prevention Unit followed by an on target discussion about safe procedures for employees and customers before, during, and after a robbery.

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## **Yell and Tell – Child Safety Program**

The Yell and Tell program is aimed at the young child, ages 4-8, who sees something dangerous, feels afraid, and doesn't know what to do. Through an easy 4 step program, children are taught how to take action and be a hero.

In 2006, Jean Davidson's 4 year old grandson, Ryder, died in an accident that could have been prevented if the child standing nearby would have known how to react. Because of this and learning of similar losses, Jean developed the Yell and Tell program. Jean Davidson is the granddaughter of Walter Davidson, one of the four founders and the first president of Harley-Davidson. Jean chose not to work at the family company but to dedicate her life to teaching children.

There are six dangerous situations covered by this curriculum. Our classes feature the Child Enticement and Guns training programs.

## **Tweens Internet Safety**

The Internet is a Pandora's Box of opportunities and pitfalls. Young people today are too willing to engage in behavior that risks their credit, their identity, and their personal safety because of the illusion of security in the expanding world of electronic communication. This Internet safety program provides talking points to connect to your audience regarding inherent dangers, criminal activity, and prevention strategies for this age group that is most at risk.

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## **Workplace CPTED**

Crime prevention through environmental design is a concept that combines natural surveillance and access control to address security concerns in our environment. Learn the key points to consider when conducting security surveys for business members in your community.

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## **Intelligence Led Policing and 21<sup>st</sup> Century Communications**

The National Criminal Intelligence Sharing Plan defines ILP as, "The collection and analysis of information to produce an intelligence end product designed to inform police decision making at both the tactical and strategic levels."

Stated plainly: Law Enforcement leaders must use actionable intelligence to guide their decision making process, both strategically and tactically. In order for ILP to work, agencies at all levels of government and of all sizes must open the lines of communication and share their intelligence. Attend this class to see how this concept is being applied in local law enforcement.

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## **Suicidal Individual at your Workplace:**

Preventing Suicide is Everybody's Business. This exciting and informative four hour course is presented by the QPR Institute.
